



Guidance and Instructions for Mobile Homes.

The Harbour Operation's Sub-Committee reserve the right at any time to restrict or close parking spaces and/or the associated areas.

Harbour Equipment [including picnic tables] wishing to be used exclusively for more than one hour by a member of the public, can be arranged with the prior consent from a Member of the Harbour Operation's Sub-Committee.

The Harbour Operation's Sub-Committee reserves the right to ban or remove any person or persons from the Harbour Estate for inappropriate behaviour/drunkenness/rowdiness and a failure to consider other harbour users, the neighbours of the harbour estate and/or members of the Public.

All visitors and users must follow and comply with the Port Erroll Harbour Rules and Byelaws. The Harbour Rules and Byelaws are displayed in the Notice Board adjacent to the Toilet Facilities. The Trustees and Committee decisions regarding failure of compliance is final.

For Mobile Home / Caravanettes / Caravans / Campers / Camping persons using the Harbour Estate there is a 3 night maximum allowable stay. After 3 nights all such users must vacate the harbour estate. Such users cannot return to the harbour estate for at least one week [7 consecutive nights].

All Mobile Home / Caravanettes / Caravan / Camper / Camping Users are requested to observe the 2030 cut off time for any generator use.

Complaints regarding use after the cut off time are taken seriously by the Port Erroll Harbour Operations Sub-Committee and will result in the above mentioned user/s being asked to vacate the harbour.

All visitors are requested to observe harbour Signs and Notices and to park 'rear in' first.

Vehicles must be parked in designated/clearly marked parking spaces/areas.

Toilets are available 24 hours a day (cold water only). Visitors/users can also dispose of their liquid waste. A fresh water supply is also available in reasonable quantities.

Mobile Home / Caravanettes / Caravan / Camper / camping users are reminded to shut off the tap when finished.

BBQ debris must not be disposed of until such time it is safe for such materials to be deposited in the bins provided. BBQ debris must not be thrown into the harbour, into the sea or on to the shore line. BBQ's must not be placed on the sea walls. Personal rubbish can be disposed of in the wheelie bins provided.

Dog owners are welcome to exercise their dogs but are reminded that all waste must be collected and disposed of in the bins provided.

There is no compulsory fee but the Port Erroll Harbour Trustees would suggest a minimum donation of £10 per night's stay which helps towards the care and maintenance of our historic harbour.

Your donation with your registration number should be placed in the green box at the head of the slipway

There is also plenty to see and do in the surrounding area - explore, you'll enjoy it.
